

Certified Cadastral Mapper (CCM)

OBJECTIVE:

The Florida Association of Cadastral Mappers, Inc. created the Certified Cadastral Mapper (CCM) designation as a means to recognize qualified and competent individuals who use, produce, and maintain cadastral maps but who are not under the jurisdiction of the Florida Department of Revenue (i.e. not employed by DOR or Property Appraiser). The CCM designation parallels the CCF designation.

ADMINISTRATION:

The CCM designation program is administered by the Florida Association of Cadastral Mappers, Inc. Applicant must be an FACM member in good standing.

QUALIFICATIONS:

In order to become a Certified Cadastral Mapper (CCM) a person must successfully pass the exams for FACM's four core courses:

- Course 1 – Mathematics for the Cadastralist
- Course 2 – The Public Land Survey System
- Course 3 – Interpretation of Real Property Descriptions
- Course 4 – Base Map Compilation

To receive credit for the above courses applicants must be present in the classroom during 90 percent of all instructional hours (unless mitigating circumstances can be documented). However, an applicant may challenge an examination and receive credit without taking the course by making an application to the Education Committee Chair, the Professional Designation Committee Chair, or their designee(s). Proctors may be appointed to administer the testing.

TRANSFER OF DESIGNATION:

Any Certified Cadastralist of Florida (CCF) who leaves the employment of a Florida Property Appraiser or the Florida Department of Revenue may change their designation to a Certified Cadastral Mapper (CCM) by applying in writing to the Professional Designation Committee Chair.

RECERTIFICATION:

To be recertified, a renewal fee of \$15.00 must be submitted to the Certification Committee Chair. The renewals are due and payable on the 31st day of December every third year from the year of certification.
